
SCENARIO BASED INTERVIEW QUESTIONS

Mrs Julie McGrath will ask questions regarding the Situational Judgement Exercise at the beginning of the interview and those questions will be as follows:

Questions -

- 1a. What are the appellant's grounds of appeal?
- 1b. What is the respondent's case?
- 1c. With whom does the burden of proof lie in the appeal?
- 1d. The appellant's wife arrives at the appeal hearing. The respondent also sends a representative. You recognise the appellant's wife as a solicitor whom you have met socially on one or two occasions about ten years ago. What issues arise and how would you deal with them?
- 1e. You proceed to introduce the proceedings, explaining the order of proceedings. The appellant's Wife is openly rude and tells you she does not need to hear this as she is legally qualified. She has not appeared previously in the Tribunal before you. How would you handle this situation?
- 1f. With reference to the Situational Judgement Exercise:
 - a) How is the assertion that the other vehicle was parked outside of its bay causing the appellant to leave space for access to it relevant or otherwise to your consideration of the appeal?
 - b) How is the appellant's assertion that he was ill and consequently in a hurry relevant or otherwise to your consideration of the appeal?
 - c) The evidence and submissions before you at the hearing are the same as those contained in the papers you have. On the facts, has the respondent established that the contravention occurred? What are your reasons for reaching that conclusion?
 - d) Would you communicate your decision to the appellant orally and / or in writing? Why?

7. Submissions

Summary of Appellant's Submissions

Representations were received from

on 08/03/2016 based on the following grounds:

- on the day that the PCN was issued was extremely ill and had left the house in order to acquire nurofen tablets. drove to but unfortunately could not get a parking space outside the chemist and was too ill to have to walk, so then drove to knowing that there was an Iceland with a car park directly outside.
- Iceland didn't have any headache tablets so then had to walk to the top of the chemist and buy nurofen tablets and when returned to the car noticed the PCN.
- * Attendant then advised that it was because of the vehicle not being parked in marked bay.
- admits that didn't realise that the vehicle was over the white line due to the vehicle next to not being parked within the bay, and then got angry and took the PCN of the windscreen to try and get the Traffic Attendant to explain why was getting a ticket especially when the car park was nearly empty and was not preventing anyone else from using a car parking space.
- asked the Traffic Attendant if had taken a photo of the car beside as it was slightly over the line forcing car to be slightly over the line as well.

TransportNI Submission

The Penalty Charge Notice (PCN) was issued on to vehicle registration as it was not parked wholly within the markings of the bay/space in the traffic Attendant noted the details in their handheld computer before taking 10 photographs and attaching a PCN to the windscreen of the vehicle.

A DVLA NI enquiry was made on 25/01/2016 which provided the details of the registered keeper of the vehicle. A Notice to Owner was issued to

Representations were received from on 08/03/2016 as summarised above. The representations were considered but no grounds were established to warrant cancellation of the PCN. A Notice of Rejection of Representations was issued on 06/04/2016.

Transport NI Contends:

- The Off Street Parking Order (Northern Ireland) 2000 Article 5 states "The driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in a parking place other than in a position wholly within a parking bay where such has been marked out."
- Photographs taken by the Traffic Attendant at the time that the PCN was issued shows vehicle registration not parked wholly within the markings of the bay/space.
- The photographs also show that the lines are clear showing the individual markings of the bay/space.
- The last photograph taken by the Traffic Attendant shows that a copy of the Off Street Parking Order is on display in Car Park. .
- The additional photograph (Tab 13) also shows the red house sign which instructs motorists
 to "Park wholly within a parking bay" and that a "Penalty charge notice may be issued for
 failure to comply with these instructions".
- No observation period is applied by the Traffic Attendant for this contravention. It results in the issue of an instant PCN.
- The appellant states that they have bought a pay and display ticket and displayed it on the windscreen of the vehicle. The purchase of a pay and display ticket does not absolve a driver of the requirement to park wholly within the markings of the bay/space.
- also states that they were unable to park their vehicle wholly within a marked bay/space due to the vehicle that was parked beside them being over the white line. The Department would advise that if there were no proper places with adequate room to park within the markings of the bay/space, the onus is on the driver to find another space with adequate room to park legally within a marked bay.
- No payment has been received and the outstanding balance is £90.00



I refer to your representations in connection with the issue of the above Penalty Charge Notice.

The PCN was correctly issued. Your vehicle was not parked completely within a marked bay. Article 5 of the Off-Street Parking Order (Northern Ireland) 2000 states "The driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in a parking space other than in a position wholly within a parking bay where such has been marked".

On the basis of this information, I have to advise you that grounds for representation have not been established and this letter is issued as a formal Notice of Rejection under Article 9 (4)(b) of the Traffic Management (Northern Ireland) Order 2005.

Under Article 12 of the Traffic Management (Northern Ireland) Order 2005 I must inform you that a charge certificate may be served under Article 14(2) unless before the end of the period of 28 days from the date of this notice, the penalty charge is paid, or you appeal to an adjudicator in the Traffic Penalty Tribunal under Article 13 of the Order.

You now have 28 days to either pay the Penalty Charge or appeal to the Traffic Penalty Tribunal (see below).





PAYMENT OF PENALTY CHARGE

You must pay the Penalty Charge of £90 within 28 days of the date of this letter. Failure to pay will result in the Issue of a Charge Certificate, which Increases the Charge by 50% to £135.

You may appeal to the Traffic Penalty Tribunal against this decision within 28 days of the date of issue of this Notice of Rejection. The Adjudicator will consider your appeal and make an independent decision that is binding on both you and TransportNI.

Under Article 3 of the Traffic Management (Proceedings before Adjudicators) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2006 a notice of appeal –

- shall include the name and address of the appellant (you);
- may specify some other address as being the address to which you wish documents to be sent in connection with the appeal;
- shall state the date and any reference number of the disputed decision;
- may include any representations which you desire to make in addition to the original representations.



- should include a statement justifying any delay if the notice of appeal is delivered later than the time limit mentioned above. An adjudicator shall treat any such statement as a request for extending that time limit.
- should be signed by you or someone you wish to act as an authorised representative

If you wish to submit a notice of appeal please read the attached guidance notes issued by the Traffic Penalty Tribunal detailing what will happen next. You should then complete the attached notice of appeal form and return it to the address shown.

Costs

Under Article 12(1) of the Traffic Management (Proceedings before Adjudicators) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2006 the adjudicator shall not normally make an order awarding costs and expenses, but may make such an order—

- against a party (including an appellant who has withdrawn his appeal or the Department that has consented to the appeal being allowed) if he is of the opinion that the party has acted frivolously or vexatiously or that his conduct in making, pursuing or resisting an appeal was wholly unreasonable; or
- against the Department, where he considers that the disputed decision was wholly unreasonable.

An order shall not be made against a party unless that party has been given an opportunity of making representations against the making of the order.


1 Dear Sir/Madam, 2 on Tuesday, 22nd December I was extremely ill and I left 3 the house in order to acquire Nurofen tablets. I drove to Main Street, Moira, but unfortunately could not get a 4 parking space outside the chemist and I was too ill to 5 have to walk so I then drove to Lurgan knowing that there 6 7 is an Iceland beside the car park where I could park directly outside. I drove into the car park, parked my 8 car directly outside the front of Iceland, went to the 9 parking meter, put enough money to cover my parking and 10 displayed my ticket on the front of the car. I went into 11 12 Iceland but they had no headache tablets so I then had to walk to the top of the main street in Lurgan to the 13 14 chemist, which I think is called Savers, and I purchased 15 two boxes of Nurofen. I returned immediately to the car, whereupon I noticed a traffic warden issuing a ticket to 16 my vehicle. I immediately said to her that I had paid 17 18 for my ticket and displayed it on the front of the car, and pointed this out to her. She said 'I know, I have 19 seen it'. I said then why am I getting a parking ticket. 20 She continued to ignore me and when I kept questioning 21 her and she eventually said that my car was over the line 22 of the parking bay. I said to her that I had no idea 23 24 that it was over when I parked, due to the car beside me 25 being over their white line. She continued to ignore me and write the ticket. I became very angry, partly because I was extremely ill, and took the ticket from the windscreen of the car to try to get her to explain to me why I was getting the ticket as the car park was mostly empty and I was not preventing anyone else Trom using a

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1	car parking space. She went behind the car to take a
2	photo of my car and I asked her had she taken a
3	photograph of the car beside me as it was over the line
4	and consequently I was then forced to be slightly over my
5	line as well (without my knowledge) to ensure
6	accessibility for the other driver to their driver's
7	door.
8	She said she did not take a photo of the other car and
9	that she had completed issuing her ticket. I said to her
10	to remain in the spot while I took a photo of the other
11	car so that I had proof that I was taking a correct
12	photo. She said she had finished issuing her ticket and
13	had no interest in anything further I had to say and
14	walked off.
15	Firstly, I would like to say that I have never
16	intentionally flouted the law and have never had any
17	disagreement with any law enforcement agency before and
18	would consider myself to be an excellent driver. I would
19	never intentionally park over the white line but in this
20	instance I was forced to, unknowingly, as the other
21	driver beside me was over their line. I was only away
22	from the vehicle for a very short time to purchase
23	headache tablets and, as I said, the car park was half
24	empty so I was not preventing anyone else from having a
25	car parking space. If you view the photograph you will
26	see how far my tyre was actually over the line and
27	certainly would not impede anyone from using the space
28	beside me.
29	I have been driving for 26 years and I have never as much
30	as had a speeding ticket in all that time and I would not




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knowi	ngly ever break the law so you will understand why]
am so	annoyed as to be blamed for doing something over






